- **Digital Citizenship:** What is it and what is needed (Netsafe's positioning based on research)
- **Whose responsibility?** The school/tertiary setting's role; student & community involvement
- **How can staff pragmatically address needs?** Weaving in your values, education frameworks (NZ Curriculum) and an overview of available resources.
- **Harmful Digital Communications Act:** Briefly overview of the Act, discuss online incidents & challenges faced within the education context.
- **Staff wellbeing and safety** in relation to online environments, digital devices and ethical responsibilities.
